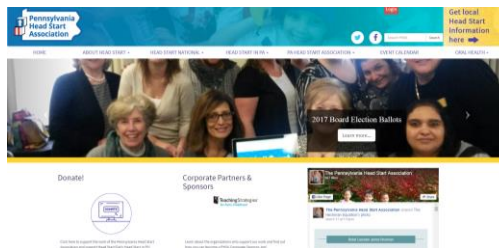
Pennsylvania Child Care Association (PACCA)

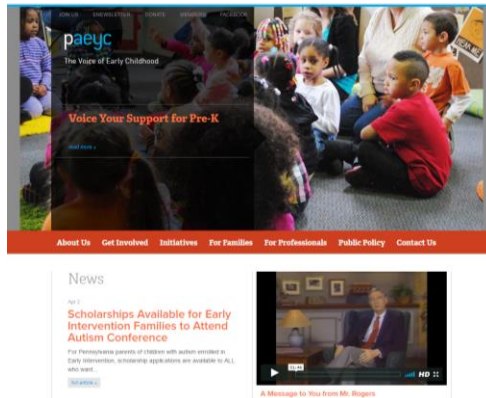

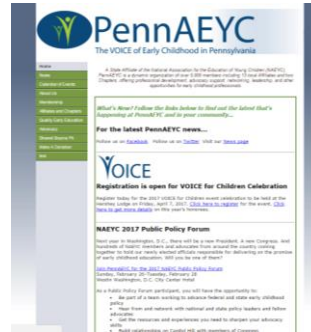
